

## **Introduction**

## A. Consonants differ from vowels in:

- Constriction i.e. a narrowing made by articulators in the vocal cords (vocal folds).
- This Constriction can be **full** or **partial** during the production of consonant sounds.
- Vowels are characterised with tongue-height, frontness/ backness and lip
  position while Consonants are based on three main aspects: manner of
  articulation, place of articulation and voicing (Ogden, 2009 & Robinson, 2010).

## **B. Speech Organs:**

represent all organs that are involved into producing a sound. The latter can be a consonant or a vowel.
