What is a sentence?

Letters make words. Most words use small letters.

e.g. teacher, family, good, write

Some words use **capital letters** and small letters together.

e.g. Professor Garcia, State University

- ♣ A sentence always begins with a capital letter. It also has one space between two words. Finally, a sentence usually ends with a period.
- ♣ A **statement** is a sentence that **gives information**. A statement always ends with a **period**.
- e.g. My next class is at noon.

my essay is about me. X My essay is about me. ✓

Myessayisaboutme.

My essay is about me.

✓

♣ If the sentence asks for information, it is a question. Many questions use a question word.

Some question words are who, what, where, when, why, how, do, and did.

A question ends with a question mark.

When is your next class?

There are other words that can begin questions, like *are*, *is*, *was*, and *were*. If you use one of these words at the beginning of a sentence, put a question mark at the end.

- **4** There is also punctuation used in the middle of sentences, called **commas**.
- Use a comma when you write dates. The comma goes between the day and the year.
- e.g. School starts on September 1, 2013.
 - O Use commas when you write lists that have three or more items. Put a comma after each item except for the last item. Remember to put a comma before the word *and*.

E.g. Ivan is taking math, science, and history classes.

♣ Sentences make **paragraphs**. It is important to write paragraphs correctly. A paragraph is about one idea.

The first line of a paragraph is indented. To indent, type about five spaces before the first word.

A paragraph is not a list of sentences. At the end of a sentence, type a space. Then begin the next sentence.

Do not use all capital letters: **JOE IS FROM BRAZIL** → Joe is from Brazil.
