- 3. Describe symptoms, diagnoses, and therapy procedures using accurate structures.
- 4. Read and understand short professional texts or case reports.
- 5. Write simple descriptions and reports about speech therapy situations.
- 6. Improve pronunciation and fluency through thematic dialogues.
