

# Let's Meet Tom

Tom is a 30-year old chiropractor. He loves his job and is very dedicated at it. In his job, he talks a lot to his patients thus appearance is important.

Tom feels he's been haunted by bad luck. Tom was involved in an accident when he was young. He experienced a trauma as a child when both (11 and 21) teeth were exarticulated. Both were replanted, however, trauma on one of the teeth led to extraction of the other. Thus, both 11 and 21 are now lost. The patient now wishes for a permanent solution for these teeth. He has consulted several dentists but feels that they cannot help him.



Tom has been earlier referred for implant installation, however, when the flap was raised, it was discovered that it was very thin with little bone left, probably a fracture of the alveolar in connection with the extraction, thus, the crest was extremely narrow and a bone regeneration operation was performed.

The patient then undergoes a second surgery and it is discovered that the Bio-os membrane and BioGuide are basically gone. Again, it is estimated that implant cannot be installed.

Tom is disappointed of the treatment and is a bit suspicious. He has a temporary removable denture and wishes a more permanent solution. Also, he wonders if it is possible to fix his rotated 12 and 22. He claimed that “they were not like that before the accident”!
