What happens during a neurological exam / assessment?

- Medical history: Your neurologist will ask about your medical history, including any symptoms you are experiencing, medications you are taking, and previous medical procedures.
- **Physical examination**: the specialist will likely examine your physical coordination, reflexes, muscle strength, and sensitivity to touch.

- Interview Questions:

- **1-** Are you experiencing any current neurological concerns such as headache, dizziness, weakness, numbness, tingling, tremors, loss of balance, or decreased coordination?
- **2-** Have you experienced any difficulty swallowing or speaking?
- **3-** Have you experienced any recent falls?
- **4-** Have you ever experienced a neurological condition such as a stroke, transient ischemic attack, seizure, or head injury?
- **5-** Do you experience any shaking or tremors of your hands? If so, do they occur more with rest or activity?
- **6-** Do you ever feel lightheaded or dizzy? If so, does it occur with activity or change in position?





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- **7-** Are you currently taking any medications, herbs, or supplements for a neurological condition?
- **Objective Assessment:** The physical examination of the neurological system includes assessment of both the central and peripheral nervous systems and data are collected through:
 - a) Inspection
 - b) Auscultation
 - c) Palpation
